Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of this program, each Participant will be able to:

1. Describe the roles, functions, and responsibilities of a preceptor.
2. Apply principles of adult learning when precepting new staff.
3. Through the use of hypothetical case studies and group exercises, demonstrate the knowledge, skills, and attitude of an ideal preceptor.
4. Use concept mapping as a tool for teaching critical thinking skills.
5. Role play different strategies and approaches that can be used in resolving actual/potential preceptorship problems.

Course Description:

This is a one-day competency-based preceptor training program designed to prepare the registered nurse for role transition from staff nurse to a Preceptor. The course content has been adopted from the preceptor training program developed by the American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN). The focus of this course will be on the preceptor's role, responsibilities, establishment of rapport, and integration of knowledge, skills, and attitudes into practice.

Target Audience: Registered Nurses working in outpatient and inpatient care settings who are new in the Preceptor role.
